Early Years Foundation Stage

(EYFS) Nursery

Key information about this half term

We are very excited to be welcoming your child into the Nursery at Leverton Primary School. Starting Nursery is always a very exciting time, although some children may naturally feel a little nervous. Please be reassured that we will spend lots of time getting to know your child and helping them to settle into their new environment and routine.

This half term, we will be following the theme of 'Marvellous Me'. We will start by learning all about one another, our interests and what makes us special. We will begin to read and share stories such as 'Owl Babies', a lovely story about three baby owls who are left in their nest while their Mum goes out to find food. This will provide an opportunity for us to talk about wildlife and the changes in the Season at this time of the year. We will also support the children to paint a self-portrait, using a mirror to look closely at their facial features.

Literacy

Writing: When your child starts school they will be doing lots of activities to help strengthen the muscles in their hands ready to start writing such as using play dough tools. They will also explore making marks in a variety of ways using different media and we will be starting to explore lines and shapes that will later become pictures and letter shapes.

Name Recognition: Once the children are settled, they will be asked to practice finding and recognising their names. They will start by looking at the first capital letter and then move on to the lowercase letters.

En joying and Sharing Books

Your child will be given a library book to take home and share with their family every week. Right from the start, we aim to provide lots of opportunities for children to engage with books so that we can excite their imagination and interest.

Communication and Language

The children will develop their speaking, listening and understanding skills as they play and interact. They will practice following instructions as they learn new routines, and we will encourage them to ask for a snack saying 'please' and 'thank you'. We will also gather as a class on the carpet every day for short periods to share stories, sing songs and learn some Nursery rhymes.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

In the first half term, we will spend a lot of time explaining the rules and why they are important. The children will learn the importance of sharing and taking turns and we will talk about our feelings and the feelings of others. Children will learn independence skills as they explore the classroom and find an apron for example. They will also learn how to look after their own belongings and where to store them.

Physical Development

The children will participate daily in activities that enhance their physical development. These will include **fine motor work**, such as threading, manipulating tools and drawing and **Gross motor skills** such as running, jumping and climbing. We will also aim to develop the children's awareness of how to stay healthy and safe. Daily outdoor play is an important part of our provision in Nursery. From the beginning we aim to make the children have as much access to the garden as possible. They will practice putting on and taking off their own coats, washing their hands and tending to their own toileting needs.

Maths

This half term, we will practise saying numbers in order and learn lots of songs and chants to help with this. We will practice counting children as part of our daily routine and we will count objects as we play. The children will be encouraged to touch count using I:I correspondence where possible, and say the last number for the total amount. We will also be use lots of comparative language, comparing and measuring size, height and length as the children build towers with blocks for example.

Expressive Art and Design

The children have the opportunity to explore our role-play both indoors and outdoors which helps them to learn new vocabulary, make friends and explore our topic in an imaginative way. We also have planned art and craft activities each day where we can learn about materials and how to combine them through collage, playdough and paint activities.

Understanding the World

We will spend lots of time getting to know each other this half term and talking about our favourite things, our likes and our dislikes. We will also discuss who is special to us, where we live, if we have any pets, and what we enjoy doing. We will look at photos of our families, and think about how we are similar and different to one another.
